Calculating the Bond Tax Impact

One of the biggest questions asked about the bond presented this May is, “How much will it cost?” The following will attempt to help you answer this question based on a \$42.3 million dollar bond.

If you don’t know the parcel ID number, you may have to search for it by the owner’s name. Once there, you can either click on the parcel you want to view, or get the parcel ID number. (The Nemaha County site is a little different in comparison to Johnson, Otoe and Pawnee.) You will then see the information regarding the parcel under headings such as:

- Parcel Information
- Current Value Information
- Prior Year Value Information
- Yearly Tax Information
- Sales Information
- Outbuilding Data
- Agricultural Land Information
- Photos

For the purposes of the bond tax impact, you will want to look at “Current Value Information”. The final tax impact numbers are the best estimates based on 2021 values. Should the bond pass, the levy will be calculated using 2022 values. Also, should values go up, the levy may go down. The statutory requirements of 75% of agriculture/horticulture and 100% of home/commercial are used for the following examples. These percentages may vary from year to year.

Agriculture/Horticulture Values & Impact

First, we will start with agricultural/horticultural values as these are impacted by LB2 (new state legislation that limits new bond tax asking to 50% of value). An example is shown here:

Current Value Information			
Land Value	Dwelling Value	Improvement Value	Total Value
\$1,160,144	\$0	\$0	\$1,160,144

The land value shown is 75% of the actual value. Therefore, you will need to get it back to 100% in order to find the bond impact by dividing the Land Value by .75.

$$\mathbf{\$1,160,144 / .75 = \$1,546,858.67.}$$

Now take the 100% value and multiply it by the LB2 valuation of .50.

$$\mathbf{\$1,546,858.67 \times .50 = \$773,429.33.}$$

This number is now 50% of the total land value. To find the bond impact take this number times the bond (.42) and divide it by 100.

$$\mathbf{(\$773,429.33 \times .42) / 100 = \$3,248.40.}$$

In this example, the landowner will pay an approximate \$3,248.40 in land taxes, in addition to their current land taxes, for the purposes of the bond.

Home/Commercial Values & Impact

Next, let's look at the bond impact on a home or commercial property. For either of these, you will want to use the Total Value. This is already valued at 100%, therefore this one will be a little easier. Same thing, start at the assessor's site and search for the parcel.

Current Value Information			
Land Value	Dwelling Value	Improvement Value	Total Value
\$18,840	\$151,348	\$16	\$170,204

Simply take the total value, multiply it by the bond rate of .42 and divide by 100.

$$\mathbf{(\$170,204 \times .42) / 100 = \$714.86}$$

In this example, the homeowner will pay an additional \$714.86.

Johnson County Central is working with DA Davidson (bond underwriter) developing a bond levy increase calculator. Using this tool, you can simply input the county assessor's land value from your parcel and it will calculate the approximate increase in taxes.

Johnson County Central Public Schools **BOND ELECTION**

Project Why

- **Safety & Security** – Our goal is to ensure our facilities meet building, safety and fire codes, and that students and staff have secure facilities to learn and work in.
- **Community Pride & Unity** – A new school facility promotes community pride from across Johnson County.
- **Expanding Educational Goals & Student Needs** – Education and technology is ever-changing and investing in new, flexible facilities will enable the district to meet these changing needs.
- **Being Responsible Stewards of District Resources** – The renovation, maintenance and operation of multiple facilities is cumbersome and inefficient. Taking advantage of current low interest rates is a responsible way to make a long-term investment of district resources.

Project Description

The proposed, new facility is approximately 125,700 square feet and would accommodate all educational and extracurricular services for grades PK-12 except Industrial Arts (shop classes) and the wrestling room. It will accommodate all staff except the superintendent's office, the business office, and the technology coordinator's office. Shop space, wrestling room(s), superintendent's office, business office and the technology office would all be maintained in the current high school building with minimal renovations needed.

Total Cost

The proposed project will cost approximately \$42.5 to \$43.5 million based on architecture and engineer design, and construction team estimates.

Did you know?

- LB 2 took effect January 1, 2022. It states that when repaying school bonds, agricultural and horticultural land is valued at 50% of its actual value. Prior to the passage of this bill, agricultural and horticultural land was valued at 75% of its actual value.
- The estimated cost to renovate JCC's three existing buildings to meet current needs only is over \$26 million.
- JCC provides transportation services to facilities for 265 students every school day at the cost of approximately \$188,326 for the school year. These costs don't include transportation to school activities or on-going vehicle maintenance.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given to the qualified electors of Johnson County School District 0050 (Johnson County Central Public Schools) in the State of Nebraska (the “**District**”) that an election to be held in conjunction with the Statewide Primary election has been called and will be held in the District on Tuesday, May 10, 2022, at which time there shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the District the following proposition:

“Shall Johnson County School District 0050 (Johnson County Central Public Schools) in the State of Nebraska issue its general obligation bonds in an aggregate stated principal amount not to exceed Forty-three Million Three Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$43,375,000), for the purpose of paying costs of land acquisition and the construction and acquisition of pre-kindergarten to 12th grade facilities for the District; and providing for the necessary furniture, equipment and apparatus for such facilities; such bonds to be issued from time to time, to bear interest at such rate or rates, to be sold at such prices and to become due at such time or times as may be fixed by, or determined at the direction of, the Board of Education; and

“Shall the District cause to be levied and collected annually a special levy of taxes against all the taxable property in the District sufficient in rate and amount to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due?”

- FOR such Bonds and tax
- AGAINST such Bonds and tax

Electors voting in favor of such proposition shall blacken the oval opposite the words “FOR such Bonds and tax” following such proposition, and electors voting against such proposition shall blacken the oval opposite the words “AGAINST such Bonds and tax” following such proposition.

The polls will be open continuously from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on such date. The voting places for qualified electors of the District will be the same as the voting places designated for the Statewide Primary election. The polling places are accessible to individuals with physical mobility limitations.

Every student qualified for HOSA - State Leadership Conference in their chosen categories. HOSA State Leadership Conference was held March 13, - March 15, 2022. During these dates students competed against other schools (mostly A & B schools) for a chance to compete at the HOSA - International Leadership Conference. Students also attended breakout sessions to learn more about a variety of health issues, career opportunities, and furthering education. The Creative Problem Solving team (Salena Conley, Kali Drake, and Bonnie Mejia) received 3rd place and earned themselves a competition spot at HOSA-ILC. The HOSA-ILC will be held in Nashville, TN, June 22-25, 2022.

Creative Problem Solving provides members with the opportunity to analyze the problem-solving process and to work as a team to apply their problem-solving skills in creating a solution to a hypothetical health or HOSA-related problem. This competitive event consists of 2 rounds and each team consists of 3-4 people. Round One will consist of a written test and the score will be used to qualify the team for Round Two. In Round Two teams will be given a potential problem related to HOSA, the health community, or a specific health issue and have 30 minutes to analyze the problem. At the end of the preparation time, teams will have eight (8) minutes to present their solution to a panel of judges. This event aims to inspire members to be proactive future health professionals and utilize higher order thinking to solve complex challenges.
