The December 11, 2024 regular school board meeting will mark the end of tenure for board members Becky Plager, Arlin Beethe and Bob Hutt. During the last eight years of Becky and Arlin's time on the board, and during the last four years that include Bob, much has changed with Johnson County Central.

The school board hired an interim superintendent, Dr. Galen Boldt, in the wake of Mr. Jack Moles resignation to become the Executive Director for NRCSA (Nebraska Rural Community Schools Association). During Dr. Boldt's two years as superintendent, the board began taking action to update facilities and form a plan to unify all students and programming at one site. As part of that plan, a contract for the option to buy 52 acres of land adjacent to the football field was drafted and signed. A construction manager at-risk was hired (Boyd Jones) and architects/engineers (Clark Enersen) to help assess the facilities situation and devise a plan moving forward. Since that time, there have been multiple meetings by the board committees, the board and with the public. Along with two attempts at a bond to construct new educational facilities.

Needless to say, the board members have spent a great deal of time taking in information, listening, discussing and making decisions that impact education at Johnson County Central. And not just for the school bond efforts. At board meetings, school board members are asked to read, review, understand and give feedback on policies, state and federal regulations, school financing, budgeting, school transportation, staff negotiations, curriculum, maintenance, buildings and grounds and extracurricular activities, just to name a few. It is a lot of information and some very big decisions.

That being said, I want to express sincere gratitude to our board members who are leaving us. They have exhibited genuine and passionate commitment to education at Johnson County Central and given an immense amount of time and effort to their appointment.

JCC's Carsyn Gregory (2nd Grade) is one of the Nebraska Department of Transportation's "Name a Snowplow" winners! Carsyn's submission "Avalanche" was selected and the snowplow will make its way to JCC's Tecumseh Site Elementary on Friday, December 6 for introduction.





As part of Johnson County Central's commitment to students' safety and mental health, beginning in November 2024 we are launching an anonymous reporting program, which will allow students and parents to make anonymous reports about concerns of safety or student wellness. Our program is student-focused, as opposed to crime-focused, meaning it is a tool for alerting caring adults about students who need help—not snitching. This is part of our continuous effort to increase campus and student safety, and provide students with a safe, completely anonymous outlet to share concerns. Students can use our new Safe2HelpNE app to report: bullying, suicide concerns, depression, sexting, stealing, threats, cutting, abuse, dating and domestic violence, fights, drugs, alcohol, weapons or other types of dangerous situations that threaten their safety or the safety of others. Their reports will be addressed by a trained school threat assessment team.

When you or your student have a concern, you can go to www.safe2helpne.org on your computer, tablet, or laptop-- or you can download the free Safe2HelpNE mobile app-- and make a 100% anonymous report in less than five minutes.

The use of anonymous reporting apps in state programs like Safe2Tell Colorado have proven to be successful in providing the tools and information needed for school officials and to proactively address concerning behaviors, potential incidents of violence, and other harmful situations on campus before they develop. We look forward to working with you and your student to continue making Johnson County Central a safe school.

Also as you head out to watch your fellow Thunderbirds play basketball this winter please remember to be respectful to the referees!

There is also another major rule change in high school basketball this year. The shot clock. We have installed clocks in both the high school and middle school and plan to use them for as many JV games as possible and now we are required to use them for all varsity games. Here is some basic information from the NFHS about the rule:

Begins with 35 seconds

Starts when: players inbounds the ball, a team controls possession after a rebound, control of a loose ball.

Resets when: a personal or technical foul, jump ball that favors the defensive team, violation occurs.

Does NOT reset when: the ball is deflected out of bounds by the defense, injury, jump ball that favors the offense

Resets to 20 seconds: intentionally kicked or fisted ball

Speaking of basketball rules, I ran across this article and thought some of you would be interested. It has to do with misunderstood rules in basketball. I have included some highlights and more common ones that I tend to see but if you want to read the whole list you can find it on the South Dakota High School Activities Association website: https://www.sdhsaa.com/

Most Misunderstood Basketball Rules

- **The front, top, sides, and bottom of the backboard are all in play. The ball cannot pass over a rectangular backboard from either direction. The back of a backboard is out of bounds as well as the supporting structures
- **The traveling rule is one of the most misunderstood rules in basketball. To start a dribble, the ball must be released before the pivot foot is lifted. On a pass or a shot, the pivot foot may be lifted, but may not return to the floor before the ball is released. A player may slide on the floor while trying to secure a loose ball until that player's momentum stops. At that point that player cannot attempt to get up or rollover. A player securing a ball while on the floor cannot attempt to stand up unless that player starts a dribble. A player in this situation may also pass, shoot, or call a timeout. If the player is flat on his or her back, that player may sit up without violating.
- **The hand is considered part of the ball when the hand is in contact with the ball. This includes holding, dribbling, passing, or even during a shot attempt. Striking a ball handler or a shooter on that player's hand that is incidental to an attempt to play the ball is not a foul, no matter how loud it sounds or how much it hurts.
- **Reaching in is not a foul. The term is nowhere to be found in any rulebook. There must be contact to have a foul. The mere act of reaching in, by itself, is nothing. If contact does occur, it's either a holding foul or illegal use of hands foul. When a player, in order to stop the clock, does not make a legitimate play for the ball, holds, pushes or grabs away from the ball, or uses undue roughness, the foul is an intentional foul.
- **Over the back is not a foul. The term is nowhere to be found in any rulebook. There must be contact to have a foul. A taller player may often be able to get a rebound over a shorter player, even if the shorter player has good rebounding position. If the shorter player is displaced, then a pushing foul must be called. A rebounding player, with an inside position, while boxing out, is not allowed to push back or displace an opponent, which is a pushing foul.

**A defensive player does not have to remain stationary to take a charge. A defender may turn away or duck to absorb contact, provided he or she has already established legal guarding position, which is both feet on the playing court and facing the opponent. The defender can always move backwards or sideways to maintain a legal guarding position and may even have one or both feet off the playing court when contact occurs. That player may legally rise vertically. If the defender is moving forward, then the contact is caused by the defender, which is a blocking foul.

**The intent of the three-second rule is to not allow an offensive player to gain an advantage. Referees will not call this violation if the player is not gaining an advantage. There is no three-second count between the release of a shot and the control of a rebound, at which time a new count starts. There is no three-second count during a throw in. There is no three-second count while the ball is in the backcourt. Allowance shall be made for a player who, having been in the restricted area for less than three seconds, dribbles in or moves immediately to try for goal

**Officials do not make calls that decide the outcome of a game. Players commit fouls and violations; officials view those infractions, judge the action, and then apply the rules of the game to what they had viewed. The rules then determine the penalty. Officials are on the court to be the only unbiased arbiters of the game. Officials are not concerned with who wins or loses, but only fairness and safety. Everyone else in that gym cares about winning, and therefore cannot look at the game objectively.

Who: Students in grades PK-6 Where: JCC's Tecumseh Site

When: 4:15 PM-6:15 PM each day school is in session

JCC will once again provide an after school program. The program is for students in preschool through the 6th grades. The intent of the program is to provide quality services to students as their caregivers make the transition from work to home. Students will be provided with homework assistance, learning opportunities and engaging activities. Mrs. Amber Baehr is the After School Program Coordinator and will serve to organize activities and programming for the students.

Tuition for the program is set at the following:

- \$25 per week for 4-year-old preschool students through 6th grade students.
- \$20 per week for 3-year-old preschool students.
- Each additional sibling will be \$15 per week.

*Tuition must be paid in advance and can be paid on a monthly or weekly basis.

Transportation to the after school program will be provided for students coming from the Cook Site. However, parents/guardians will be required to provide transportation for their child at the conclusion of the program each day.


To register your child for the after school program, simply contact the school office and submit your tuition payment.

FAFSA Help Available on Monday, December 16th- 6:00- 8:00 PM

Treve Florum from Education Quest will be here on Monday, December 16th in Mrs. Schuster's classroom to help students and families with the 2025-2026 FAFSA (the federal financial aid application needed for students attending college in 2025-2026. Students will need to bring their iPads to this event. Please make sure that student iPads are charged. All families will be mailed information on what they need to bring with them to fill out the FAFSA. If you have everything on the list available, you should be able to finish your FAFSA that night, if you don't, you can at least get started, which should be helpful as well. You don't have to arrive right at 6:00 PM, but please do not arrive any later than 7:20 PM to start your FAFSA.

ACT Prep Classes- December 4th and 11th

On December 4th and December 11th, JCC will be offering ACT prep classes for high school students. We will serve supper to students who participate from 6:15 to 6:45 PM. After that, there will be two ACT study sessions- Session 1 from 6:50 to 7:30 PM and Session 2 from 7:35-8:15 PM. Students will pick two subject area sessions to attend each evening. There will be sessions in English, Math, Reading, and Science. All high school students received an email on how to sign up for these sessions. All students must be signed up by Monday, December 2nd.

Apply For a Susan Thompson Buffett Foundation Scholarship- If You Qualify

Starting on November 1st until February 1st, Nebraska high school seniors can apply for a Susan Thompson Buffett Foundation scholarship. The Susan T. Buffett Foundation has offered scholarships to college students in Nebraska for over 50 years. Scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis to first-time freshman entering college who live in Nebraska, graduate from a Nebraska high school (or GED) with plans to attend a Nebraska public college, and demonstrate financial need. Around one-thousand scholarships are awarded to Nebraska high school seniors each year. These scholarships cover academic costs at Nebraska public community colleges, state colleges, and state universities for up to four years. There are several steps that students must complete in order for their application to be considered. Education Quest: Help with College Planning, Financial Aid, and the FAFSA

Nebraska's New Universal FAFSA Requirement- All Seniors in the Class of 2025 Must Fill Out the FAFSA

Nebraska law now requires all public high school students to complete and submit a FAFSA (or actively opt-out) as a graduation requirement starting with the graduating class of 2025. This type of requirement is also referred to as a Universal FAFSA requirement. FAFSA became a graduation requirement with the passage of revised statute 79-729 in 2023. This legislation applies to seniors who will graduate in 2025 and beyond.

The Nebraska legislature determined that the FAFSA is an excellent opportunity to learn of financial aid they may receive, to encourage postsecondary education, and to make more informed college-going decisions. There are many resources to complete the FAFSA. If students need help, they can definitely ask Mrs. Reuter. Filling out the FAFSA does not mean that students must make the ultimate decision of going to college. The FAFSA just allows them to see what financial resources are available to them if they decide to go to college.

If students and their parents decide that filling out the FAFSA is not right for them, for any reason, there is a waiver form available in both English and Spanish. Students who do not fill out the FAFSA must complete a waiver form with their parents and turn it into Mrs. Reuter by May 1st.




"Election Days" in Kindergarten - Mrs. Borrenpohl
