Now that the school year has come to a close, it is time to look forward to the next! The weight room will be open starting May 28th and run through August 2nd. There will be three sessions in the morning and one in the evening that athletes will have the chance to get in and work out. The weight room will be open Monday-Friday with session times running from 6:30 AM-7:30AM (HS BOYS), 7:30 AM-8:30 AM (HS GIRLS), 8:30 AM-9:30AM (JUNIOR HIGH MIXED), and 6:00 PM-7:00PM (OPEN MIXED) **except Fridays. Athletes are strongly encouraged to attend 4 out of 5 days a week and to be in attendance on a regular basis. It is very important that our athletes take advantage of these opportunities to increase their abilities and give us the best chance to compete in the upcoming school year. Please help keep your athlete accountable with the weight room and the various sport-specific camps they will be asked to attend! Summer is a very important time to develop themselves, hone in on their skills, and be together with their teammates.

Lastly, all students, grades 9-12, who plan to participate in NSAA-sponsored activities during the 2024-2025 school year need to turn in a signed Parental Consent form. This must be done before a student is eligible for practice and competition in any activity that is under the jurisdiction of the Nebraska School Activities Association. The participating student and one of his/her parents or guardians must sign the certificate of consent and turn it into the school office.

Each student, grades 7-12, who expects to participate in athletic contests shall present to the superintendent, principal, or school representative once each year, before actual participation in any interschool sport, a physician's certificate on a form recommended by the NSAA that he/she is physically fit for athletic participation. This physical examination must be given during the school year in which the student participates or during the summer vacation period which precede the school year in which the individual participates. Also, all incoming 7th graders, freshmen, and juniors must complete the ImPact Concussion test to establish a baseline in the event of a head injury. This test will be conducted by school officials and must be done before an athlete is allowed to practice or participate in a contact sport. Please contact the school if you have any questions and please take care of this prior to the **beginning of fall practice on August 12, 2024.**

We are looking to install a new fixed digit scoreboard and video board at the football field. This would be one of the first outdoor video boards in Southeast Nebraska at a high school football field.

We envision this project as tying three threads together: our video boards, our Striv broadcasts, and our digital media classes.

This outdoor video board project also provides us with some instrumental tools to better facilitate integration of these three threads into one major upgrade that will increase the production quality of all three facets.

What we are planning includes some of the things that we already are known for when it comes to our Striv program. New features such as instant replay will be featured on both indoor & outdoor displays, as well as the JCC Striv livestreams. Live track results will also bring eyes to the outdoor board.

We have looked at multiple bids and have decided to pursue a Daktronics video with the longevity estimated to be longer than a decade. Daktronics displays are manufactured down to the LED in South Dakota, creating an American-made quality video board that will measure 13 feet tall and 24 feet wide, with a pixel pitch of 10 mm.

Sign Up For the PSAT If You Are Interested in the National Merit Scholar Program

The PSAT/NMSQT is offered each fall to high school juniors. This is the only qualifying test for the National Merit Scholar program. It is a major accomplishment to score high enough on the PSAT to become a semi-finalist as only the top 1% of all PSAT scores qualify for this honor. All semi-finalists, then go through an application process to decide who becomes finalists. If any 2024/2025 JCC junior wants to take the test, they need to let Mrs. Reuter know by September 15th, at the latest. The test is now only able to be given online and there is a lot of technical setup involved in getting computers ready for testing, so we need time to get this done. It costs \$18 to take the PSAT, payment must be received before your test will be ordered.

High School Students and Parents- EducationQuest is an Important Resource

EducationQuest is an excellent resource for all Nebraska high school students and their parents and families. Whether it's exploring colleges and future options, understanding how to plan for college or figuring out how to pay for college, EducationQuest has all of the information you could ever need and people available at their offices to answer any questions you may have. They are especially helpful when it comes to applying for financial aid and filling out the FAFSA. The FAFSA (free application for federal financial aid) should be filled out by every student planning to attend college whether they will qualify for federal aid or not. The reason is because it's a tool that most colleges and universities use to award institutional aid as well. In talking with a representative in the financial aid office at UNL, there are several scholarships that go unawarded because students they could award them to do not have a FAFSA on file. Filling out the FAFSA can be daunting and confusing as it changes every single year. Visit EducationQuest's website or call their Lincoln office at 402-475-5222 for help. They always have someone willing to help! I have called them many times and I've helped students call them many times. They are willing to talk to any students or parents who have any questions about college planning or financial aid.

Build Our Nebraska- Explore Apprenticeship Programs

Going to college is only one option for a student for after high school. There are other options as well. If a student learns best while working, an apprenticeship program may be a great option for them. The Build Our Nebraska website gives information on registered apprenticeship programs in the state of Nebraska. These are for students interested in working in trade fields who are not interested in going to college. These programs are generally pay as you learn and work programs. There will always be a need for workers in the skilled trades, especially as more and more workers in the skilled trades are retiring. 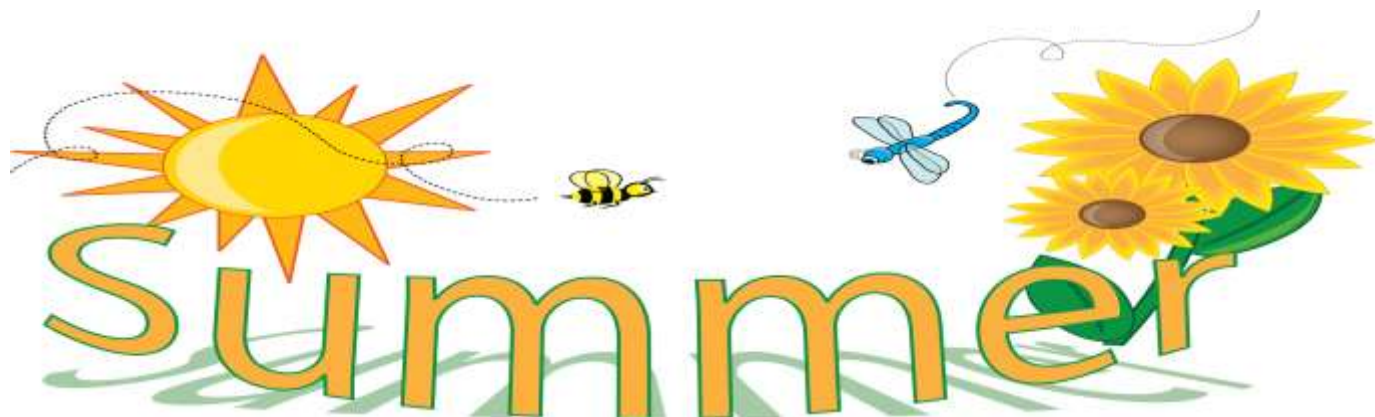

BACK-TO-SCHOOL PHYSICALS

BACK TO SCHOOL PHYSICALS...

It is time to start thinking about physicals for sports and school participation.

- ◆ **ALL Kindergarten students** (entering school for the first time) are required to receive a physical/vision screening, and immunization screening from a healthcare provider.
- ◆ **ALL 7th grade students are required** to receive a school physical with immunizations reviewed and booster shots if needed.
- ◆ **ALL students transferring from out-of-state** require a school physical/vision screening, and immunization screening.
- ◆ **ALL students, grades 7-12, that plan to participate in athletics** will need a sports physical.

NSAA physical forms are available at the Tecumseh and Cook sites.

Please bring completed physical clearance forms to your child's school after their physical is completed.

*Please call your healthcare provider to schedule an appointment.

ALL PHYSICALS MUST BE COMPLETED PRIOR TO THE START OF SCHOOL, AND PRIOR TO THE START OF THE FALL ATHLETIC SEASON FOR ALL ATHLETES.

Coaches will need to receive completed physical forms prior to an athlete's participation in practice.
