1964-2025



He was our "go to" guy for any rules and regulations in the athletic arena, especially for track & field and basketball. Rich excelled at golf, something he wouldn't admit, and on a scramble team filled with amateurs remained humble, patient and encouraging. He knew how to make some of the best concession stand popcorn. He was a calm source of wisdom, reason and advice. Rich was a unique leader with a subtle, witty humor. He allowed his team a voice and the opportunity to lead. He knew what it meant to be a selfless, humble part of a team.

Rich served the Nemaha Valley and Johnson County Central School Districts for 36 years. The last 18 years he was the Cook Site Principal, working alongside his wife Marsha Bacon who is the Cook Site Counselor. The two could often be found together greeting students at the doorway, or seeing them out the door at the end of the day. Together they served JCC students with genuine care and compassion.

Their sons, Harrison (sophomore) and Jamison (7th grade) attend the JCC district as well. Rich's family, being a husband and father, was his greatest love.

JCC School Board News

- The school board met with representatives from Boyd Jones (Construction Manager at Risk), DA Davidson (Financial Advisers), Clark & Enersen (Architects) and Mr. Russ Koch (Facilities Adviser) on Wednesday, February 24 to start considering a construction bond project.
- Mr. Rother has been in communications to discuss the acquisition or leasing of the former Dollar General building in Tecumseh as a potential wrestling facility.
- Several new hires were approved: Mr. Justin Damme (High School Principal), Dr. Laura Rademacher (Director of Student Services/SPED), Ms. Zadie Plager (3rd Grade), Mrs. Carroll Segrist (High School Spanish).
- Mr. Rother and the board have discussed adding an elementary principal and making the Activities Director a full time administrative position, however these positions will be dependent on the budget.
- The board discussed investing in more upgrades to the facilities to include: re-sodding and building up the crown on the competition football field, replacing the basketball hoops on the North side of the high school gym, resurfacing the track, sanding and resurfacing the high school gym, upgrading the shot put throwing area, replacing some of the broken concrete and upgrading the kitchen hood vents in the kitchens.
- The kitchen hoods are quoted at \$100,000 to \$125,000 each. We are currently seeking additional quotes. The hoods must have a fire suppression system, proper venting and communicate with the school's fire alarm system.
- The Tecumseh Site HVAC systems are also a topic of discussion as they will need to be upgraded as the freon used in our current system will no longer be available in coming years.

NEWS FROM PRINCIPAL RICK LESTER

Spring is just around the corner...which means Prom is near! JCC High School Jr. & Sr. Prom is scheduled for Saturday, March 22, 2025 at Hartman's Cattle Company. Pre-Prom meal is scheduled for 6:30 p.m. and the dance will start at 8:45 p.m. until 11:00 p.m. then Post-Prom will leave for Omaha Sports and Games at 11:30 p.m.

To help ensure that we have a safe, drug and alcohol free Prom and Post Prom, the Johnson County Sheriff's department will be administering breathalyzer tests before the Pre-Prom meal and before students attend Post Prom. Prom participants will also have a ticket of admission form to sign.

A very important date you need to mark on your calendar is Tuesday, March 25, 2025. All juniors in the State of Nebraska will be required to take the ACT test on this date. Our JCC juniors will test at the high school - and around the first week of March, high school counselor Mrs. Reuter will be mailing out a letter with the agenda for this day to all junior parents. On this day we do have plans for the rest of the high school students - our seniors and freshmen will be going on college visits or career/industry tours, and our sophomores will be taking the Pre-ACT test.

Johnson County Central Foundation Scholarship Applications- Due March 21st

The Johnson County Central Foundation is offering nine scholarships to JCC seniors this year. To apply, seniors must fill out the application that was emailed to them. Seniors will need to follow the instructions on the application and also have two references, one from someone in the school, and one from someone outside the school (an employer, community member, church pastor, etc.) There will be three \$2000 four-year college/university scholarships awarded, three \$1000 two-year college scholarships available, and three \$1000 trade school scholarships awarded. All scholarship applications must be given to Mrs. Reuter by March 21st.

Nebraska's New Universal FAFSA Requirement- All Seniors in the Class of 2025 Must Fill Out the FAFSA

Nebraska law now requires all public high school students to complete and submit a FAFSA (or actively opt-out) as a graduation requirement starting with the graduating class of 2025. This type of requirement is also referred to as a Universal FAFSA requirement. FAFSA became a graduation requirement with the passage of revised statute 79-729 in 2023. This legislation applies to seniors who will graduate in 2025 and beyond. The Nebraska legislature determined that the FAFSA is an excellent opportunity to learn of financial aid they may receive, to encourage postsecondary education, and to make more informed college-going decisions. If students and their parents decide that filling out the FAFSA is not right for them, for any reason, there is a waiver form available in both English and Spanish. Students who do not fill out the FAFSA must get a waiver form from Mrs. Reuter, complete the form with their parents, and turn it into Mrs. Reuter by May 1st.


Gabriel Burki

Kindergarten Round-Up



WHEN: Monday, April 14, 2025

9:00-11:00 a.m.

WHERE: Johnson County Central Elementary Building in Tecumseh.

WHO: Children residing in the Johnson County Central school district who are, or will be, age 5 on or before July 31, 2025.

Individual letters will be sent in April to the parents of all Kindergarten ready students residing in Johnson County Central's school district. If you do not receive a letter, please call the school and let us know that you will be attending the 2025 Kindergarten Round-Up.

If applying for early registration (child will be 5 years old on or after August 1 and on or before October 15), JCC must have received your written request by March 13, 2025.

JCC Preschool Enrollment for the 2025-26 School Year Opens February 1, 2025

Dear Family,

We know you are your child's first and most important teacher, and we would love to join you in the education of your young learner. The purpose of the Johnson County Central Preschool Program is to promote the social, emotional, intellectual, language, physical, and aesthetic development and learning for the children served and to promote family development and support. The preschool schedule encompasses discovery through active involvement. Activities, materials, and equipment reflect and respect the diversity of race and multiculturalism and the physical and mental abilities of all children. It is preferred that your child be fully toilet trained before entering the program.

The program will be available to children of the following ages:

- Children who are 3 years of age on or before July 31 of the enrollment year;
- Children who are 4 years of age (on or before July 31 of the enrollment year) at the start of the enrollment year; and
- Children who are 5 years of age at the start of the enrollment year, so long as they do not turn 6 years of age prior to January 1 of that year (subject to the participation limitation below).

All enrollment is subject to capacity limitations and established enrollment priorities. Three-year-old children will only be offered half-day attendance. Four-year-old children will be offered full-day or half-day attendance. The full-day option will be filled on a first come, first served basis.

Five-Year-Old Participation - Participation of 5-year-old students who will not turn 6 prior to January 1 of the enrollment year will be further limited to those students who have met the score criteria per district policy on the Brigance Early Childhood Screen III (3–5 years).

All preschool programming will be housed at the Tecumseh site. Transportation will be provided to and from licensed child care providers at no cost. Shuttle services will run between the Tecumseh site and the Cook site. There is no tuition fee for preschool. However, breakfast and/or lunch fees will be charged when applicable.

^{*}All preschool children, regardless of their abilities, disabilities, or the social, linguistic, or economic diversity of the children's families are eligible to be served in our preschool program.
