Building Project Update

JCC's School Board, administration, Coady Pruett (JCC legal counsel from KSB School Law) and Russ Koch (Facilities Advisor) met with representative from Boyd-Jones (Contracted Construction Manager At-Risk), Clark & Enersen (Contracted Architect & Engineering Firm) and DA Davidson (Financial Advisors) to discuss options for a future bonded building project. The board members scrutinized the cost of materials for construction as they seem very high. Tim Ripp of Clark & Enerson and Mark Pfister of Boyd Jones explained that the materials cost more than residential materials because they are considered "code" for school construction. This led into further discussion and investigation into the difference between "standard" materials and "code" materials.

Taking one small example, we discussed door hardware (door knobs & locking mechanisms). Commercial door hardware used in public schools have requirements in the following categories:

- Durability & Grade (Grade 1 or 2 Commercial)
- National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Compliance Standards
- International Building Code Standards
- Americans with Disabilities Act Compliance
- Security & Lockdown Capabilities
- Vandal Resistance & Tamper Proofing
- Customization & Key Control (e.g. prevention of unauthorized duplication)
- Warranty & Longevity
- Code Compliance & Inspections
- Installation Complexity (e.g. integrate with fire alarms, security systems, and automatic door operators)

The cost difference between those that meet the requirements for school construction and those used for residential purposes can be substantial. When all the elements are included (locks, hinges, closers, exit devices such as panic bars, handles & knobs) a single commercial door hardware configuration can range from \$600-\$2,000 per door versus residential that can range from \$115-\$285 per door. This does not include the price of the door itself.

Materials used in schools are chosen due to their level of durability, enhanced security features, compliance with safety and accessibility standards (e.g. ADA,

NFPA) and the ability to withstand high-volume and high-traffic environments. Investing in higher-quality hardware ensures longevity and reduces maintenance and replacement costs over time.

Nebraska's New Universal FAFSA Requirement- All Seniors in the Class of 2025 Must Fill Out the FAFSA

If you have a senior in the class of 2025, please make sure that they have filled out a FAFSA. If not, please have them get a waiver form from Mrs. Reuter as soon as possible. Having either a FAFSA done or a waiver form turned in will be part of the senior check out process. Every senior must have done one or the other before they can check out with Mrs. Reuter. Nebraska law now requires all public high school students to complete and submit a FAFSA (or actively opt-out) as a graduation requirement starting with the graduating class of 2025. This type of requirement is also referred to as a Universal FAFSA requirement. FAFSA became a graduation requirement with the passage of revised statute 79-729 in 2023. This legislation applies to seniors who will graduate in 2025 and beyond. The Nebraska legislature determined that the FAFSA is an excellent opportunity to learn of financial aid they may receive, to encourage postsecondary education, and to make more informed college-going decisions. If students and their parents decide that filling out the FAFSA is not right for them, for any reason, there is a waiver form available in both English and Spanish. Students who do not fill out the FAFSA must get a waiver form from Mrs. Reuter, complete the form with their parents, and turn it in as soon as possible.



Back in June, the Johnson County Central Striv Crew was recognized as the Top Striv School Score winner for the 2023-24 school year. It was a great moment to have our crew, which is known to be one of the best in the state of Nebraska, earning recognition that is backed by analytics.

The Striv School Scores are calculated based on a variety of analytics such as viewership, engagement, use of tools/resources, etc.

Now in March, the JCC Striv Crew received a totally different honor - one that is really based on luck. Not analytics based. But a matter of our preparation meeting a great opportunity!

A clip from a JCC Striv broadcast was featured on ESPN's SportsCenter Top Ten Plays!

But a little background - since our first year of Striv 10 years ago, we have sent crews to help broadcast the volleyball & basketball state tournaments and football semifinals. This is an honor awarded to top crews and is one of the ways that our group earns funds for new gear.

This year, the crew broadcasted the Girls D2 Semifinals from the Devaney Center. And covered the Boys B Quarterfinals at Pinnacle Bank Arena. It was in the boys quarterfinals between Norris and Pius that our crew captured one of the all-time great moments in Nebraska State Tournament history.

On the call were JCC sophomore Jon DeFreece and one of our most active community volunteers Scott Straka.

The play was also one of the first times that the officials had to use instant replay to verify if the shot was released before the buzzer. And running the replay system that game was Marcus Scheer.

Just from tweets by JCC Striv, Striv Sports, and MaxPreps accounts, the clip has garnered more than 950,000 views on Twitter. It was picked up by ESPN and ran in the SportsCenter Top Ten Plays for Thursday -- it was the #1 play of the day!

And not only did the clip finish in the top spot, they also ran it with our audio! You could hear Scott & Jon making the call & reacting to the basket!
