### **Superintendent Monthly Update**




The Johnson County School Board attended the 2025 NRCSA (Nebraska Rural Community Schools Association) State Conference on March 20 in Kearney. The conference gives board members the opportunity to learn more about various topics relating to Nebraska's rural communities and schools, to speak with board members from across the state and to learn from other school districts. While at the conference, I was one of two presenters speaking about the four-day school week. Mr. Mike Apple, Superintendent of Conestoga Public Schools, spoke alongside me.

On the return trip from Kearney, the board members and myself visited Minden Public Schools to view their high school/middle school additions and renovations. In 2014, the Minden community passed a \$23.1 million bond to renovate and provide additions. Included in the bond was a new competition gym, classrooms, performing arts center and industrial arts spaces. In 2023, another bond for \$29.5 million to build an elementary school on the site failed.

The JCC school board visited the Minden site as their new facility was built on a slight grade and Minden leadership sought to unify all facilities on one site. This is significant as the previous proposed JCC facilities were to be built on a grade as well. JCC board members, Dan Jones, Jon Schmid, Kim Wellensiek, Sarah Weber and I toured the facilities to gain perspective, as well as insight, from Minden's board president Rusty Rhynalds and their current superintendent Jim Widdifield. Also along for the tour were Tim Ripp and Hannah Schafers of Clark & Enersen (JCC Contracted Architecture) and Mark Pfister of Boyd Jones (JCC Contracted Construction Manager At Risk).

On April 15, JCC board members Gail Hutt, Dan Jones, Sarah Weber and Kim Wellensiek traveled with me to Boone Central Public Schools in Albion and to Summerland Public Schools in Antelope County. Also along to see the facilities was Marcus Scheer (JCC Technology Director), Hannah Schafers of Clark & Enersen and Russ Koch (JCC Facilities Advisor).

Justin Damme Middle School Principal 402-864-4171 Boone Central is a district similar to JCC in that the elementary and high schools were located in Albion, while the middle school was located in Petersburg, 15 miles to the North. The Albion location also had the challenge of older facilities located in a residential area of town. This made additions and parking a challenge. A bond to move the high school South of Albion in the country failed. The district then decided to proceed with a series of additions and renovations to the current landlocked site. Through bond and building funds at over \$15 million, the district was able to unify all programming to the Albion site. This was done through major renovations (i.e. existing building "taken down to the studs," the addition of classrooms, a competition gym, a new cafeteria, purchasing homes to demolish for additional parking lots, and closing a city street to expand to approximately three city blocks). The school in Petersburg was demolished.

The JCC team was led on a tour of the facilities by Boone Central board members Ed Knott (President) and Justin Frey (Treasurer). Mr. Knott was serving on the board for some of the bond work and Mr. Frey is a graduate of Boone Central.

The touring team then drove to Summerland Public Schools. Summerland comprises the communities of Clearwater, Ewing and Orchard. A \$34.3 million school bond was passed in 2019 and the building was opened in 2020. The school was built on a new campus, in a field, approximately the same distance from each of the three communities. The Summerland school is one building serving grades PK-12 and is also built on a grade. This was my second trip to Summerland, as previous board members visited the site in 2022. We were led on tour of the facilities by Summerland Elementary Principal, Cathy Cooper and School Board President, Nate Schwager.

On the way back, the team viewed the Cross County PK-12 School. Cross County was a new building built in an open field South of Stromsburg which opened in 2008. We then viewed the Centennial school site. Centennial is also a PK-12 building located in Utica. The Centennial School District has passed multiple bonds to add a new competition gym and a performing arts center.

In all, the JCC board members took 14 hours out of their day on April 15 to research facilities. We were able to ask questions about materials being used, layout of facilities, programming needs (what spaces they needed for which classes), lessons learned and regrets. If you want to know more, reach out to our school board members and ask what they are learning about. It is a big process with a great deal of responsibility. They need to hear from YOU as well.

Mr. Rick Lester began his 41 year educational career in 1984 as the Little River High School (Kansas) Physical Education and Health Teacher (1984-1985). From there he taught PE/Health in Brewster, Kansas (1985-1987), was Activities Director and PE teacher at the Whitebead Middle School in Pauls Valley, Oklahoma (1987-1988) and then served as Assistant Principal, Activities Director and PE teacher (1988-1991). From 1984 to 1991, Rick was a Head Varsity Football Coach, Head Varsity

Basketball Coach, Head Varsity Track Coach, Assistant Varsity Football Coach, Assistant Varsity Basketball Coach and Assistant Varsity Track Coach.

Mr. Lester came to Tecumseh Public Schools in 1991 to serve as the 7-12 Principal and the Activities Director (1991-2007). When Tecumseh and Nemaha Valley merged in 2007, he became the High School Principal. Rick was the high school principal at JCC for the remainder of his career (2007-2025).

Mrs. Lisa Schuster began her teaching career at ESU7 in Columbus, NE in the fall of 1988. She served as the Itinerant Resource Teacher, Center Based Teacher and in Testing. While at ESU7 she drove to the one (1) to three (3) room school houses in Boone, Butler, Colfax, Nance, Platte and Polk Counties to provide services. She then served as Resource Teacher at Lindsay Holy Family's Junior and Senior High Schools while still providing resources to some of the small

rural schools. Lisa then took on a role with Schuyler Public Schools as a Center Based Multi-Handicapped Program Teacher; all the while driving between Lindsay and Schuyler. She then took a full-time position at Schuyler as a Special Education/English Teacher as well as being in charge of their Special Olympics. In 1995, Mrs. Schuster went to Beatrice Public Schools where she taught in both the high school and elementary, was the sponsor of SADD (Students Against Destructive Decisions) and helped with the Special Olympics.

Mrs. Schuster came to Tecumseh Public Schools in 1999 as a Special Education Teacher. When the merge of Tecumseh and Nemaha Valley was completed, she took her place as a High School Special Education Teacher until her retirement. While at JCC, Lisa served on many committees as well as coaching Special Olympics (Track, Basketball, Bowling), Junior High Volleyball, Junior High Basketball, Cheerleading, Unified Bowling, and Bowling.



The K-6 Track & Field Day will be Friday, May 16th, starting at 1:00. All grades will be at the high school track in Tecumseh. Parents are invited to come watch the fun and games.

The spring concert will be held on May 19th at 7:00 pm, where our students will showcase their musical talents.

Our 6th-grade students will be heading to the Henry Doorly Zoo on May 20th.

The 4th & 5th Grade Thunderbird Assembly and the Middle School Honor Assembly will be held on Wednesday, May 21st. Students will be recognized for any awards and academic achievements they have earned throughout the year.

As the end of the school year approaches, we'll need to turn our attention to the requirements students need to meet before they are allowed to check out for the summer. Student iPads will be turned in during the week of May 19th. Students must turn in the school-issued official Apple Lightning-to-USB cable and the full 12W charger block. Insurance does not cover lost cables and chargers. If the iPad is damaged and insurance was not purchased (or you have already used your insurance claim), you will be billed the repair cost. If insurance was purchased and it has not already been used, the repair cost will be covered by the insurance. In addition to their iPads, students will also need to have all other school materials (textbooks, library books, athletic uniforms and equipment, padlocks, etc.) turned in, and all bills, fees, and fines must be paid. Any lost or damaged items will need to be paid for. Both their school locker and their gym locker will need to be cleaned out, and all personal items must be taken home. Students will not receive their report cards until everything on their checkout sheet has been taken care of. Please have your child check in these items before the last day, so he/she doesn't have to make an extra trip back to school to get checked out for the summer.

### **NEWS FROM PRINCIPAL RICK LESTER**

Summer vacation is sneaking upon us! For our JCC students, summer means conditioning and working on their preferred sport skills for the upcoming year. Summer is also the time for JCC student's to take advantage of Driver's Education. There was a meeting held for high school students and middle school students who were interested in Driver's Education. All interested students received an informational sheet which explains the qualification for students who want to take Driver's Education. Driver's Education classes will be held from Monday, June 2, 2025 thru Thursday, June 5, 2025 from 9:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. with a thirty-minute lunch break. Classes will be held at the high school in room 200. We have a maximum of 28 JCC students who can take the Driver's Education class. With this in mind the first 28 JCC students who pay the cost of the class (\$250.00) will be admitted to the summer Driver's Education class.

In February and March all students pre-registered for the 2025-2026 school year. Once the official class schedule is complete, every student will receive a letter around the first of August which will include their schedule showing their classes and periods.

Another item that needs to be addressed is our summer school. Summer school is designed for students for credit recovery. Summer school begins Monday, June 2, 2025 and ends on Thursday, June 26, 2025. Classes are from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Monday thru Thursday. Summer school is administered through a software program called OdysseyWare. Each student will be working independently on the computer. Mr. Hedger and Mr. Hawley will be monitoring and assisting the class, and be available for questions and help. Each class has a required number of assignments each day (approx. 10-13 assignments) that need to be completed with a passing grade. All required assignments need to be completed by 12:00 p.m. on Thursday, June 26, 2025.

All parents of students who lost credits in the first semester or who are in jeopardy of losing credits for the second semester, were sent a letter on April 14, 2025 explaining this opportunity. I will meet with these students to encourage them to take summer school and the importance of utilizing this program. Summer school needs to be registered and fees paid for before the first day of class on Monday, June 2, 2025. Students may only take summer school to recover 1st or 2nd semester of a class and the fee is \$50.00 per semester of a class.




